Participant Success Story

Jose Gonzalez

Jose Gonzalez came to Community Work Services in the Spring of 2021 in hopes of overcoming various barriers to employment and seeking out training in our Commercial Cleaning Program. During his interview with his Case Manager, he



described feeling immediately “part of the family,” and this comfort was heightened upon beginning his training with Program Staff, Paul, Tim, and Robert. Jose attests that his successful training at CWS taught him responsibility and integrity and fostered significant character growth and professionalism. Since graduating the Commercial Cleaning Program and Job Readiness Training, Jose has secured a job at The Cheesecake Factory, where he has been “staying busy” learning how to apply the skills he has developed to the workforce. In reflecting on why he came to CWS and how his life has changed since, Jose affirms that CWS opened opportunities to learn the principles of hard work and discipline, and now he has the ability to practice and strengthen these skills on his own. Jose believes that through exercising responsibility, anyone can progress and change their life, and this lesson has become a reality through his commitment to CWS.
